Dear Co-workers and Friends of the Medical Section!

The time of the solstice connects us in a special way with the living earth – in summery devotion to nature in the north, in wintry inwardness in the south. Two central impulses of Anthroposophic Medicine are celebrating their hundredth birthday in these weeks: pharmacy and the anthroposophical hospitals. They highlight a vision: to work together in a house for patients in such a way that the healing powers in the patient are called upon and strengthened through the work together of nurses, therapists and doctors. A vision that is important at a time when targeted technical interventions one-sidedly shape the image of the hospital. This vision is complemented pharmaceutically by the goal of transforming nature into a diverse living garden and obtaining medicines from it that show themselves to be related to the inner healing forces in the patient and can strengthen them. The vision of a pharmaceutical art that starts from the living sphere and aims to obtain medicines from it through pharmaceutical processes that are as close to life as possible, which stimulate and strengthen self-regulation. Such an ecological and sustainably effective pharmacy of the living sphere is important in a world in which technologically constructed substances that specifically block or enhance certain functions of the organism shape the image of pharmacy in a one-sided way.

With these jubilees we look at the same time far out into nature, the living earth organism, and into the inner world of the protective house so necessary for healing processes, whose archetype is the human body itself. In his fifth lecture of 13 October 1923 from the cycle on the experience of the course of the

year in four cosmic imaginations (Das Miterleben des Jahreslaufes in vier kosmischen Imaginationen. GA 229, 8th ed., Dornach 1999, p. 69–85), Rudolf Steiner links these dimensions in a unique way. He describes as an imagination the action of cosmic archangelic beings in the living earth organism, alternating in the cycle of the seasons, and their action in the human organism, culminating in each case in the "opposite season" to their action in external nature.

Rudolf Steiner describes this action in the fundamental sequence in which the human being themselves transforms substances out of nature for themselves, builds up and maintains their body with their help and unfolds their spiritual and soul life.

In the intake of food and the transformation of substance in the metabolic system, the forces of Gabriel in the **summer time** take particular effect: "Those who understand nutrition correctly understand the beginning of healing." (ibid., p. 79). All nutrition requires its balance, its vitalisation through the breathing. All balancing and thus healing processes in the human organism emanate from the respiratory processes in the broad sense: "For all healing forces originally lie in the human respiratory system." (ibid., p. 75). And these are connected with the action of Raphael in the human organism, which reaches its culmination in the autumn season. Our power of thought is particularly closely connected with the work of Uriel in the winter time, to whom we owe it that the cosmos can be spiritually reflected in our spherically rounded head and that our self-consciousness can unfold. And finally, this arc culminates in the power of movement of our limbs, in the human willpower which receives its impulse from Michael in the spring.

In this sequence the essence of a sustained healing process becomes clear at the same time. To begin with, the focus is on the nutrition and nursing of the patient, which also tries to replace what they have lost in vital forces on their way into the illness. Today, the nutrition question also reveals a planetary side, as the nature and quality of our food is directly related to the question of whether we make the earth a desert or a garden.

Healing processes are directly related to the ability to intercept and balance pathogenic processes. We owe this potential to rhythmical processes, first and foremost the respiration and circulation, through to the rhythm of waking and sleeping which is essential for maintaining and regaining health and in which our soul exhales and inhales. In breathing, we also connect with our fellow human beings, indeed with all living beings on earth, in the envelope of air we share. What triggers fears in a pandemic, the mutual contagion through breathing, is only the flip side of the fact that we are all connected in the warmth-air envelope of the earth — and as humanity have become respon-

sible for its healthy balance. In doing so, we feel that the question of our common atmosphere is not only an ecological and cosmic one, but also a social one.

Healing – for the human being as well as for the earth – only becomes sustainable when we change and develop our thinking. Sustainable healing requires self-knowledge, individually, as a community, as humanity. In many life crises, the thinking plays a decisive role in breaking away from habits that make us ill and turning to the essentials. Because reality becomes how we think it. In anthroposophy we approach the earth, like the human being, in our thinking from the living sphere, come about and animated by the work of spiritual beings. In every encounter with another person, but also, for example, in the deepened experience of the solstice, an encounter at an essential level becomes possible that can change us permanently.

After all, healing manifests itself in how we become able to act anew, move anew, create something new. How insight and inner experience become will, attitude and action and the power and spirit of the sun begin to shine out of us.

In this spirit, we want to turn to human and planetary health in our annual conference, deepen our schooling path and exchange professional ideas with colleagues. Online registration for our annual conference is now open (https://www.goetheanum.org/en/human-and-planetary-health).

With gratitude we view the very recent opening of the Goetheanum, where in July the drama of humanity Faust will be shown four times in the outstanding new production which has been further worked on since the premiere in 2020 (https://www.faust.jetzt/).

Looking back, we are pleased about the Romanian online IPMT which took such a lively course with more than 60 participants.

An important contribution from the CARE V working group, to which we already referred in the last newsletter, is the **statement on assisted suicide** (https://www.anthromedics.org/PRA-0981-EN) and the discussion recorded on this subject in the Goetheanum series "Life and Society in Transition" with the physicians Matthias Girke, Madeleen Winkler and Raimund Klesse, President of the Swiss Hippocratic Society (in German; online from 5 July 2021 at https://www.goetheanum.tv/leben-und-gesellschaft).

We are concerned about the worldwide suffering of children and young people, who are hardly affected by COVID-19, even in terms of their health, due to governmental pandemic measures. Here we draw attention to the Medical Section's media library, where the five-part online lecture cycle on infant health May/June 2021 will continue to be available in

English, German and Spanish until the end of the year (https://medsektion.goetheanum.org/en).

With regard to the COVID vaccination for children and adolescents, the Medical Section coordinated and contributed to the contents of the statement of the Society of Anthroposophic Physicians in Germany (https://www.gaed.de/stellungnahmecovid-19-impfung-kinder).
