Dear Co-workers and Friends of the Medical Section,

The present teaches us how essential it is to have a common consciousness of the world and to work together, encompassing head, heart and hand. In the middle part of the Foundation Stone Mediation quoted above, we can practise time and again to reflect in our soul on our social actions and failures to act with their consequences. The attitude addressed in it is central to learning to live in peace and to help people in need. It addresses an essential dimension of our therapeutic profession. A dimension that we experience in our heart: as the voice of conscience, as an organ of perception for the You, as a social organ of resonance in the community of human beings.

International annual conference

Our international annual conference "The heart around us — The importance and meaning of the therapeutic community" from 13 to 18 September 2022 (https://www.goetheanum.org/en/the-heartaround-us) turns its attention to the human heart and the therapeutic community. It begins and ends by with the concrete question as to how we can shape medicine in such a way that a person's powers of recovery stand at the centre and are strengthened. Here the question at the beginning is, what is health. Machteld Huber will set out how health and community are connected and what changes can be trig-

gered in medicine if this question is followed up with the same consistency with which we investigate and treat diseases. Are we able to encounter ill people in such a way that they also feel that they are recognised in their potential, in what is essential for them in life? And that, on the other hand, their need for a supportive therapeutic community is met at the same time? How do we ourselves overcome conflicts and crises in therapeutic communities and work together in a healthy way? We are devoting a lecture evening and a workshop with Herbert Salzmann, who is active in this field, to this question.

As last year, the conference itself will be divided into three parts: parallel specialist conferences of the different health care professions with joint supporting lectures form the start. This is followed by the middle part, which is dedicated to spiritual deepening. The emphasis this year is on training our capacity for therapeutic community building. The third part focuses on concrete therapeutic collaboration. In the various international, multiprofessional workshops, it takes the heart theme through the five CARE areas of Pregnancy and Early Childhood, Infectious Diseases, Anxiety and Trauma, Oncology and Palliative Care and the field of Cardiology. At the same time, we include topical subjects such as artificial intelligence and robotics and the question of the image of the human being in medicine. The conclusion is formed by the question as to a system of medicine of the future fit for human beings and the importance and meaning of the power of the heart for therapeutic community building.

We are delighted that this year it is once again easier to meet as a world community at the Goetheanum. The importance of such a direct international human encounter for inner strengthening, mutual encouragement and cooperation, and thus for the further development of Anthroposophic Medicine cannot be overestimated. We hope for lively participation from all regions of the world! Booking of conference tickets will be exclusively online in future and will be possible from 30 May 2022. In this context, we are also grateful for donations to enable colleagues to travel and participate who are unable to do so from their own resources.

Visit to Georgia

Matthias Girke was able to visit the impressive new therapeutic centre in the centre of the Georgian capital Tbilisi at the end of April. On the ground floor, there is a modern pharmacy open to the public and for the extemporaneous preparation of triturations, ointments, ear drops, globules and dilutions by certified pharmacists. The therapy building also has a medicinal herb garden, looked after by a botanist. It comprises four medical practices (two for general medicine

and family care and one each for paediatrics and gynaecology); two additional physicians (for cardiology and oncology) will be included in their special surgeries. The establishment of an oncological outpatient clinic is planned and will also offer modern oncological treatments. Patients can receive oil dispersion baths, nursing treatments, rhythmical massage therapy, eurythmy therapy, art therapy and biographical counselling. A hall for patient seminars and lecture events is currently being upgraded. We are very impressed by the initiative and strong implementation of the exclusively female Georgian team!

Early years conference

For spur-of-the-moment decision-makers, we take this opportunity to warmly invite you once more to the international early years conference "The dignity of the child – I feel good in your eyes" (https://www. goetheanum.org/en/the-dignity-of-the-child) which will take place at the Goetheanum from 15-18 June and which we are organising together with the Pedagogical Section. The time of pregnancy, birth and early childhood is crucial for the development as well as the health of the child. In the corresponding CARE working group of the Medical Section, which prepared this conference, paediatricians and gynaecologists, midwives, nurses, eurythmy therapists, art and body therapists work together with pre-school teachers and colleagues from early intervention and social work.

The paramount importance of this phase of life is increasingly being recognised worldwide, and we are pleased about the broad spectrum of international expert contributions and workshops at this conference, in which Michaela Glöckler will also participate with several contributions.

Further training

In November 2022 a new IPMT (International Postgraduate Medical Training) will begin in Spain. After intensive preparation by the Spanish umbrella organisation for Anthroposophic Medicine (FECISA) and the Spanish Medical Association (ACMA), the first module will take place in Madrid from 30 November to 4 December 2022. In addition to the IPMT modules, there are weekend courses for the individual therapeutic professional groups to deepen their knowledge. The participants can aim for occupational certification upon completion of this training. This means that there will be multiprofessional Spanish-language training for Anthroposophic Medicine in Europe. We would be very grateful if you could draw the attention of interested Spanish speakers (from training courses, medical studies or already working) to this IPMT!

In January 2023, the English Medical Training in Anthroposophic Medicine will begin its second run. We are very pleased that this English-language medical training is now starting again after the successful first course, offering interested colleagues worldwide a certified further training in a hybrid format.

New course in rhythmical massage therapy in Switzerland: On 8 September 2022, the new three-year part-time course will begin in Zurich. It is affiliated to the Anthroposophical Academy for Therapy and Art and accredited by the Organisation der Arbeitswelt KomplementärTherapie. Graduates are awarded the corresponding sectoral certificate and can continue on to the higher vocational examination to obtain the Swiss diploma as a complementary therapist. The training consists of the modular training part for the basic qualifications and the sequentially structured methodological training with internship. The leadership of the training course is represented by Thomas Bur, Liliane Ammann Albertin, Dr med Angela Kuck and Claudia Zangger Stauffer. Working week of sculpture, music and speech at the Kolisko Academy in Germany: The working week on the topic of "The breathing human being and the lungs" will take place in Stuttgart from 7–12 November 2022 and is aimed at physicians, all therapeutic professional groups and their students. Quality development through IKAM accreditation procedures: Training courses and educational provision within Anthroposophic Medicine are of high quality. This is due not least to the IKAM accreditation procedure, which has been developed continuously across all professions since 2000. A group of specially trained auditors from the various professional fields, certified by the Medical Section, assesses the working methods and quality of training, further training and advanced training provision in Anthroposophic Medicine. The group has been working unobtrusively with

expertise and empathy in the background for many years, serving to further develop and improve training within nursing, eurythmy therapy, art therapies and the methods and professions of body therapy. Physicians and psychotherapists use a procedure of their own. The auditors undergo regular continuing training and continue to develop the procedure, most recently on 25 February 2022, virtually due to the pandemic. Training courses to become an IKAM auditor have so far been held in German-speaking countries and in German. In the future, training courses will be offered on an international level, partly online and partly in person, in order to meet the growing demand in other countries and continents. The anthroposophical quality procedure is characterised by the fact that it puts appreciation of what has been achieved and resource-oriented thinking and action in the place of control and monitoring. The accreditation process is intended to affirm the respective educational institution in its strengths and offer assistance for the further development of its provision.
