Dear Co-workers and Friends of the Medical Section,

"The heart around us"– The annual conference 2022

It was a great pleasure to welcome around 600 participants from more than 30 countries to our 2022 annual conference, including participants from Ukraine and Russia and, after the pandemic years, from South America and South-East Asia again.

The conference motif of "The heart around us" was tangible: the third part, the multi-professional conference, dealt with the significance of the heart in the biography of the human being with touching contributions from paediatrics, adulthood and finally on the experiences in the care of the dying person. In the 20

or so working groups of this part of the conference, the various professional groups were able to present their activities and their collaboration and report on therapeutic experiences. A concluding presentation by our Brazilian colleague João Torunsky (Erzoberlenker of the Christian Community) explored the importance of the heart forces in community building and highlighted how bringing people together requires a sacrificial power connected with the heart. We have to "sacrifice" preconceived opinions and ideas for a true human encounter, also personal impulses and

intentions, in order to find a free space and a common language that enables community building and thus a heart quality in working together.

The first part of the whole conference consisting of six specialist conferences (medicine and pharmacy, art therapy, creative speech, eurythmy therapy, patient advocacy and psychotherapy) was introduced by a lecture from Machteld Huber on "positive health". This concept (www.iph.nl) acquired considerable prominence in the Netherlands by focusing on the personal wishes of patients for their recovery and making them manifest in a six-part scheme that includes aspects such as bodily functions and mental well-being, but also quality of life. In the meantime, "positive health" has also spread outside the Netherlands and in Colombia has reached South America. There is meanwhile also a handbook available in English explaining the Dutch way.1

This year, anthroposophical body therapies were not represented with their own conference but could be physically experienced by anyone who was interested, as representatives of various methods - including rhythmical massage therapy, massage as developed by Dr Simeon Pressel and chirophonetics – offered free treatments in a yurt: this offer was enthusiastically taken up by many and was able to convey new insights in a practical way.

The middle part of the conference focused on the spiritual deepening of the art of healing. It was introduced by a contribution on community building, its spiritual sources, the constitutional elements of the community and their care. Trust as an essential community-building force arises from opening up and committing oneself to the other person, requires their understanding, an affectionate relationship and action oriented towards the other. In the workshops, work was done on topics of the School of Spiritual Science and further deepening. As last year, there was productive work on the Gospels which has special significance with regard to medicine, its ethics and therapeutic attitude.

The annual conference left those attending with much gratitude and new impulses that they took home and to their work places, and so we hope that the personal encounters at the Goetheanum will enliven anthroposophical work worldwide.

The 2023 annual conference will take place from 12 to 17 September, and we hope for many different participants from near and far!

A challenge: Ensuring the supply of anthroposophic pharmaceuticals

There are major challenges facing anthroposophic pharmaceuticals, as the meeting with the pharmaceutical manufacturers following the annual conference once again clearly showed. We are working intensively internationally to improve the supply of anthroposophic pharmaceuticals through national extemporaneous (prepared according to prescription) production. Many obstacles have to be overcome; both Weleda and WALA are working to support this process with the corresponding starting materials. In Brazil and Italy, and soon similarly in Germany, ampoules are also produced extemporaneously. In addition, our pharmaceuticals need more research and evaluation, good communication and information on their indication, efficacy and practical use.

There are significant changes coming in the product ranges of the manufacturers; Weleda's industrial production of medicinal products will be concentrated at the site in Schwäbisch Gmünd (DE), where some of the WALA preparations will also be ampouled in future. The industrial production of medicinal products is cost-intensive, forms the basis of regulatory approval or registration and is justified by the corresponding level of prescription frequency. Extemporaneous production, on the other hand, allows flexibility, economic production of small batches, facilitates the reestablishment of anthroposophic pharmacy at

a national level and the introduction of innovative anthroposophic medicines. Both forms of production thus have their relevance and justification.

In this context, we would like to refer once again to the **Pocket Vademecum**, which was initially published in German this year. With this book, a good adviser for everyday therapeutic questions has been published which presents a selection of important medicinal products and external treatments in detail, fits into the coat pocket and can thus become a companion in therapeutic work.

The **CARE work** in the Medical Section has developed further and it has been possible to publish some new texts on the Anthromedics specialist portal (www.anthromedics.org/? locale=en). These articles are published in German, English and Spanish and are read by a growing number of interested people.

From Mexico to China

This year, too, we can report on **several IPMTs** (International Postgraduate Medical Training) worldwide, some of which were happily able to take place again as pure in-person events.

In **Mexico** an IPMT cycle was completed in-person, with eight Mexican doctors gaining certification in Anthroposophic Medicine — we were able to welcome two of them at the annual conference in September. This IPMT with Martin-Günther Sterner and Mónica Mennet-von Eiff included a pharmaceutical course in which colleagues from other Latin American countries also participated on a hybrid basis.

For the first time after the pandemic years, an IPMT took place in Masloc in Romania with 40 participants attending in-person. In the morning, the focus was on a live patient presentation; in the afternoon workshops, practical instruction was given on external treatments (Gabriela Cimpeanu, Ursi Soldner), pharmaceutical work was done (Horatio Miresan), psychotherapeutic questions were clarified (Hartmut Horn) and medical histories from Romanian physicians were discussed (Georg Soldner).

In July, the hybrid IPMT took place in **Taiwan**. In this second year of the new IPMT cycle, the focus was on the theme of the living. While from the Medical Section Boris Krause and Rolf Heine helped to shape the IPMT, significant contributions were made from the Taiwanese side both in the morning eurythmy, Goethean work and textual work as well as in workshops during the afternoon.

It is gratifying that another IPMT could also be held in **St Petersburg** (RU) in 2022 with 65 participants. It was largely organised by our Russian colleagues working with Denis Koshechkin, with the collaboration of the Swiss music therapist Viola Heckel.

The second IPMT took place in **Slovakia** this summer. About 110 people from different professions worked on the topic of the living and delved into questions about the heart and the movement of the blood (Armin Husemann) as well as inflammatory diseases and their treatment (Matthias Girke). The artistic courses on the first Goetheanum (Christian Hitsch) were especially enriching. We are approaching the centenary of the fire that destroyed it on New Year's Eve 1922/23 (https://www.goetheanum.org/en/brand-tagung) — a building which made anthroposophy visible in its language of forms and in the cupola paintings.

In August, the final IPMT took place in **China**; this year it was only possible to hold it online as it was not possible for the 60 or so participants to come together in one place even within in China at that time due to the pandemic. Angela Kuck (gynaecology and obstetrics) and Georg Soldner (training path and prevention / treatment of diabetes mellitus) gave expert contributions, while the Goethean morning work and textual work was overseen by Chinese colleagues. The highlight of this online seminar was three detailed case presentations by Chinese colleagues.

The richly filled summer months drew to a close with the International Annual Conference and lead over to the future perspectives of worldwide anthroposophical medical work. A multiprofessional online training for beginners on the fundamentals of Anthro-

posophic Medicine with local real work contexts – Foundation Studies – started in these weeks (see under Notices). Interested people from many countries, especially Thailand, are taking part in this training provision.

The IPMT in **Colombia** will take place in Tuluá this October as an in-person event.

The Spanish IPMT in Madrid is scheduled to start in November, and the new English Medical Training in Anthroposophic Medicine will start in January 2023 (https://emerson.org.uk/course/anthroposophic-medicine/), registrations are still welcome.

As part of a perspectives conference on international, multi-professional training for trainers (Teach the Teachers, TTT) held before the annual conference, a new, young initiative group with 13 people from eight countries was formed to prepare the next course (expected to start 8–10 September 2023).

With good wishes for the wide range of work in and with Anthroposophic Medicine, we send very warm greetings to near and far!

Foundation Studies – Fundamentals of Anthroposophic Medicine is a new offering developed by a team from the Arlesheim Medical Training to provide the global community with a mentored online introduction to Anthroposophic Medicine. IN MEMORIAM



On 12 August 2022, Christoph Rubens, aged 58, suddenly and unexpectedly crossed the threshold on the last day of his annual leave. The chief physician in cardiology and nephrology at the Helios Hanseklinikum Stralsund (DE) died of a heart attack. "We

are deeply shocked," says hospital chief executive David Kayser. "We are losing a very valued and popular colleague in Dr Rubens. During his time at the Hanse-klinikum he supported his colleagues and patients with his love for medicine and empathy and as a person was a great asset. We will greatly miss Dr Rubens as a doctor and a person." And: "His view of medicine was more holistic than pure orthodox medicine teach-

es. Dr Rubens focused not only on the disease itself but on the whole person. His socialisation at the Waldorf School in Reutlingen and his national service at a school for the physically disabled were certainly formative in shaping this perspective. As a member of the Society of Anthroposophical Physicians in Germany, where he served for a time on the extended executive board, he perceived the human being in all their dimensions. Together with Peter Selg, director of the Ita Wegman Institute for Basic Research into Anthroposophy, he wrote the book Das menschliche Herz: Kardiologie in der anthroposophischen Medizin (The Human Heart: Cardiology in Anthroposophic Medicine)."

The staff of the Medical Section remain deeply grateful to him.



Eckehard Wagner, born on 8 August 1933, died on 9 September 2022. At the age of 89, our dear colleague and major representative of anthroposophic pharmacy found his way back to his spiritual home after long preparation confined to his sickbed at home in

Stade (DE). We owe a great deal to his decades of dedicated work in several fields. His inspiring pharmaceutical contributions at conferences were always underpinned by impressive experiments and showed a captivating enthusiasm for the world of metals and minerals and for a pharmacy renewed out of the spirit of anthroposophy. Our good thoughts go with him.



On 28 September 2022, the physician **Gudrun Burkhard**, born on 14 December 1929, passed away in Brazil. She was the pioneer of Anthroposophic Medicine in Brazil and founded several initiatives, including the Clínica Tobias, Artemísia – Human Development

Centre, where she also developed biography work in which she may be considered a pioneer worldwide. Some of her well-known books have been translated into Spanish, Portuguese and Italian, for example *Taking Charge*. Your Life Patterns and Their Meaning. She wrote a biographical reflection on her own life under the title "Und jedem Alter wohnt ein Zauber inne" (And there is magic in every age), a text published on the website of the magazine a tempo (in German, https://www.a-tempo.de/article.php?i=201207&c=8). Gudrun Burkhard was a member of the Raphael Circle and will now work for Anthroposophic Medicine from the spiritual world, we thank her for her important work.

Matthias Girke: Entwicklungswege der Seele. Die Grundsteinmeditation Rudolf Steiners, Dornach 2022.

The Foundation Stone Meditation given by Rudolf Steiner for the founding of the Anthroposophical Society in 1923 supports community building and is a source of strength for the cultivation of anthroposophy in all its fields of life.

Contemporary challenges such as questions about our own being, giving meaning to our biography, and the development of a relationship with our social environment and the cosmos that is in keeping with our nature require new abilities that can be developed through a meditative path of cognition.



Friedrich Edelhäuser: Wahrnehmen und Bewegen. Grundlagen einer allgemeinen Bewegungslehre, Stuttgart 2022. In this phenomenologically oriented work, the way that perception and movement arise is fundamentally analysed. Self-movement shows itself to be the central and constitutive factor that cannot be derived from anything else. In a

rigorous pursuit of this approach, human movement becomes accessible in this work as an intentional act

of an experiencing and corporeal being that in action realises a meaningful and goal-oriented relationship with the world. The importance of the brain and the nervous system in this process is analysed, as is the viability of embodiment concepts.



Harald Matthes, Friedemann Schad, Ralf-Dieter Hofheinz (Eds): Integrative Onkologie. Ein Beratungsmanual für Ärzte und Apotheker, Stuttgart 2022. Holistic view instead of routine treatment – 39 experts from their respective disciplines present the principles of integrative oncology: how cancer develops, image

of the human being, the shortcomings of conventional therapies; integrative therapy systems, scientific validation; special medicinal products, evaluation; specific disease situations; common tumours, treatment; oncology guidelines.



Georg Soldner: Naturwissenschaft, Medizin und Gesellschaft. Reflexionen in Auschwitz-Birkenau, Arlesheim 2022. This 64-page publication is the elaborated written version of a seminar contribution by Georg Soldner on 12 March 2022 on the topic of "Natural science and the threat to medicine: then, today, tomorrow". 
standing of what has been and for the preparation of a different future, in the midst of current challenges.



Michaela Glöckler: Das Herz als Ort des Gewissens. Wege zu geistiger und körperlicher Immunität, Stuttgart 2022.


