In contemporary events we are faced with military conflicts, the suffering that results from them, and the emerging spectres of a polarisation between East and West that was thought to have been overcome. We are experiencing the economic consequences, the energy crisis, the climate crisis with the threat to the earth and its atmospheric envelopes. The attacks on anthroposophy, especially in Central Europe, fit in with this signature of the present time. They are part of 2022, this year which is coming to an end, where

100 years ago the most powerful attack on anthroposophy took place: the burning down of the first Goetheanum.

Peace comes from understanding, needs the interest in the other and the recognition of their being. May the Christmas season bring this light in interpersonal encounters, ignite warmth in togetherness and develop life forces for the new year.

We warmly thank all of you for all the work that has been done in the year that is coming to an end, for the many wonderful personal encounters in the countries and during this year's annual conference, as well as for the exchange in our discussions. Through working together in community, the Christmas forces of light,

warmth and life can unfold and lead the being, whom we commemorate with the Christmas festival, to let sun forces shine in the relationship between human beings and in the community. May they lead to confidence, joyful moments and fruitful creativity in the new year!

### Intensive IPMT work worldwide

We are very pleased that this year we could begin our IPMTs in the countries as real meetings. The first country was Romania, followed by Slovakia and in October Colombia: about 130 people from the different therapeutic professions met there near Cali to work together for a week in a concentrated way. Some medical colleagues in Colombia have already been certified as anthroposophic physicians. A separate course was dedicated to anthroposophical nursing, as well as to psychotherapy, body therapy, and painting and music therapy. The difference to the preceding virtual training weeks during the pandemic was tangible. There is no virtual substitute for human encounters.

Within the framework of the pharmaceutical training — carried out by Albert Schmidli in collaboration with the pharmaceutical IKAM coordinators Mónica Mennet-von Eiff and Annette Greco — pharmacists are being trained anthroposophically in South America, Eastern Europe and Asia. In the Colombian capital Bogotá, the extemporaneous production of anthroposophic medicines is planned in a pharmacy.

In December, another in-person IPMT week will take place in **Bangalore/India** and bring together numerous people from different therapeutic approaches, here too we are pleased about the great interest.

# Pharmacy and ecology

In the current issue of the pharmaceutical journal with the highest circulation in Germany, an article on the topic of sustainable pharmacy resulting from the "One Health" work was published (in German) with lead authors Annette Greco and Mónica Mennet-von Eiff.¹ Pharmacy must make a decisive contribution to overcoming the ecological crisis. Therefore medicines should in future be assessed not only in terms of their efficacy, but also in terms of their ecological impact on planetary health. This applies not only to their production but also to the environmental consequences of

their use (e.g. antibiotic resistance) as well as after their excretion (e.g. groundwater contamination by painkiller residues). "We can only develop healthily as humanity if we keep the earth as a whole – in interaction with animals, plants and the soil – healthy. Moreover, ecological exploitation often goes hand in hand with social exploitation; an equitable use of planetary resources must therefore also be linked to social equity."<sup>2</sup>

The health of the human being can only develop in connection with the health of the earth. This relationship of the microcosm to the macrocosm is of decisive importance for medicine and pharmacy and is closely connected with the nature of Anthroposophic Medicine. The healing powers of the kingdoms of nature become therapeutic answers to questions posed by diseases. The comprehensive theme of the etheric, the living, which connects the life of the organism with the environment, is the focus of the upcoming Research Conference from 3–5 March 2023 with the topic and title "One Health – Studying and addressing LIFE in Medicine" (https://www.goetheanum.org/foko2023).

# Important events

We are very much looking forward to the 23rd International Study Days for Anthroposophical Arts Therapies, which will again take place as an in-person conference at the Goetheanum from 5–8 January 2023. It is about the development of the forces of courage needed to develop and shape the soul (https://goetheanum.ch/en/events/anthroposophical-art-therapies-2023).

The second training cycle of the English Training in Anthroposophic Medicine will begin at the end of January/beginning of February 2023. We are extremely grateful that participants from 14 countries attended the first cycle, which has now been successfully completed, and we very much hope that enough interested doctors will register for the new training course (https://emerson.org.uk/course/anthroposophicmedicine/).

A crucial event of the coming year will be the annual conference of the Medical Section on 12–17 September 2023. It is dedicated to the topic "Body and I — The Immune System and Autoimmune Disease". We will work on the relationship between the individuality and the body and develop a deeper understanding of the development of the human immune system and common autoimmune diseases in

which "the body turns alien", as well as discussing their therapies. The multiprofessional conference will be preceded by a conference on the spiritual deepening of medicine. It will focus on the topic of the human body as a temple, both in the work of the School of Spiritual Science and the work on the Foundation Stone Meditation and the Gospels. At the beginning of the annual conference in 2023, there will again be specialist conferences devoted to the specialties of nursing, midwifery, body therapy, eurythmy therapy, psychotherapy, dentistry and, in a joint conference, medicine and pharmacy. The latter is being prepared by the younger generation associated with the medical training at Klinik Arlesheim. Thematically, the specialist conference on medicine and pharmacy will draw on the lecture on the "invisible human being in us" and the related action of the human constitutional elements in the threefold organism given by Rudolf Steiner on 11 February 1923.

During the multiprofessional conference, the leadership of the Medical Section will be handed over to Marion Debus, Karin Michael and Adam Blanning. On this occasion we will take a look back but above all hear about the new perspectives of the Section's work

Impressions from the eurythmy therapy conference in St Petersburg (RU): Around 70 eurythmy therapists, eurythmists and physicians from all over Russia

gathered for this festive event from 29 June to 3 July 2022. Despite the great uncertainty due to the conflict in Ukraine, the conference was prepared intensively with heart and soul by Margarita Denisova from St Petersburg and Lidia Shpak as well as Tatjana Strizhak from Moscow, but ultimately by all participants – with the indomitable will to hold this conference in the St Petersburg Waldorf School despite all obstacles. Each day began with a lecture by Dr Wilburg Keller Roth on the central themes of the eurythmy therapy course, followed by "tandem working groups" - a physician together with a eurythmy therapist - on the various fields of work of eurythmy therapy (ET): Dr Vadim Sivolobov and Marina Melicheva on ET in kindergartens, Dr Denis Koshechkin and Margarita Denisova on ET in schools, Evgenia Majorova and Marina Romanova on ET in special needs education. I myself, together with Barbara Lampe had a working group on ET in oncological diseases and a lecture. In the late afternoon there were reports and films about many initiatives in various places in Russia in connection with ET, and each evening a performance prepared for the conference by eurythmy groups from various places. It was an important and forward-looking conference:



the widely dispersed groups met each other, gathered impulses for further exchange and deepened their collaboration (even though, of course, some things are still not easy, especially in the case of differences of opinion). The presence of us Central Europeans was experienced as important precisely because there is a growing awareness of the different approaches to eurythmy and ET in the West and East that were evident at the conference, and there is a desire to learn from each other. A major impulse was adopted for the development of the ET training: after Margrit Hitsch's training course finished in 2021, the Trude Thetter School in St Petersburg will in future organise the ET training in conjunction with art therapy training courses. It is scheduled to start in the summer of 2023. (Dr med Marion Debus)

As teachers, researchers and practitioners, they leave behind a wealth of results and practical knowledge. Their humanity, humour and dedicated interest in joint development.

opment will remain with us in our memory. Out of our heartfelt sympathy for their departure from earth and in gratitude, we hope for the continued involvement of Wolfgang Schad, Hans Werner and Olaf Titze from the spiritual world.

Prof Dr Wolfgang Schad: Born on 27 July 1935, died on 15 October 2022. He studied biology, chemistry and physics as well as education, taught as a class and upper school teacher and was a lecturer at the Seminar for Waldorf Education in Stuttgart. He was a member of the board of the Educational Research Centre from 1975 to 1992. From 1992 to 2005 he headed the Institute for Evolutionary Biology and Morphology at Witten/Herdecke University. He is the author of numerous books and journal articles, including Evolution als Verständnisprinzip in Kosmos, Mensch und Natur (Evolution as a Principle of Comprehension in Cosmos, Humans and Nature), Die verlorene Hälfte des Menschen (The Lost Half of the Human Being) and his opus magnum Threefoldness in humans and mammals.

Dr med Hans Werner: Born on 10 March 1925, died quietly and peacefully on 19 October 2022 at the age of 97 near Öschelbronn Hospital which he founded. He had also accompanied SEKEM's development intensively since the early 1980s and, together with his wife Elfriede Werner, founded the German Friends of SEKEM Association, of which he was chairman for a long time. In SEKEM he dedicated himself primarily to the establishment and development of the Medical Centre. "A physician's life between Öschelbronn, Russia and Egypt" was the title of his biographical review in a lecture he gave at the Paracelsus Foundation in Unterlengenhardt in February 2020.

Dr Olaf Titze: Born on 14 February 1931, died on 28 October 2022. "Olaf Titze was in the truest sense a warm-hearted person and colleague, a free spirit who had experienced the then divided Germany from both sides. He was a therapeutically creative physician who gave much of his heart and soul to anthroposophical pharmaceuticals in his professional association with Weleda, mastered his own heart disease with dignity, and also nurtured his relationship with WALA in his last years in Bad Boll."


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


