Dear Co-workers and Friends of the Medical Section,

We warmly invite you to the forthcoming annual conference of the Medical Section from 12–17 September. It will address the human autoimmune diseases, which are becoming increasingly common worldwide, and thus a multiprofessionally challenging topic. Why does my body become "alien" to me? - is the question some patients ask. And how can a familiarity with the body be restored? It is about the relationship between the spiritual being of a person, their "I", and their body. The latter not only appears individualised in its outward appearance, but is also shaped by the individuality of the person down to its smallest structures. "There is only one temple in the world and that is the human body. Nothing is more sacred than this high form." This is how Novalis put it, as quoted at the beginning, thus indirectly pointing to the divine origin of this "high form" and the "temple dweller": the human I. The body is the instrument of the I, also that of destiny. Thus the bodily constitution determines the temperament of the human being in their earthly life and thereby the character of many of their actions. The body carries within itself predispositions to health and illness which thus also help to shape destiny. It is placed in the stream of heredity and needs to be individualised in order to become a suitable instrument for the eternal being of the human being.

The being of the I joins with the body in various ways during life. In childhood it must take hold of the body and individualise it; in old age it must detach itself from it. But even within the threefold bodily structure the I is connected with the body in different ways: it can become active in the consciousness world without the body or it can take hold of the body in the activities of the will. In the nervous and sensory system the I is therefore not intensively connected with the organism, but in the metabolic and limb system it is effective in the activities of the will. The rhythmical system mediates between these two polarities and thereby determines the health of the body.

Shock-like experiences, but also chronic stress can lead to an alienation of the I-organisation from its body if there is a corresponding disposition. This means that the causes of autoimmune diseases are complex. We know about the physical, genetic dispositions. Increasingly, however, the psychosomatic, that is, mental and spiritual influences are also becoming known. Overwhelming life experiences alienate the soul and spiritual being from its body and can thus lead to autoimmune diseases, which lead either into sclerosing processes to a greater extent or develop inflammatory disease patterns. The therapeutic need here is to strengthen a healthy, warming activity of the I in the body, it is about developing new confidence in the soul and spiritual perspectives. Experiencing meaning and a perspective gives the soul new strength and reduces its restlessness and anxiety. Trust and loving human relationships have an effect that strengthens the life organisation. Hope and assurance, which arise from new perspectives and supportive life principles, have an effect all the way into the physical body. In this way, the latter can be freed from alienation and be made familiar to the person again.

Through the various therapeutic methods that we intend to address at the annual conference, we can give patients with autoimmune diseases help to alleviate the alienation of the body and to strengthen the body-oriented action of the constitutional elements.

Anthroposophic Medicine thrives on the collaboration between the therapeutic professions, needs exchange and interdisciplinary development. This includes the spiritual deepening of the therapeutic work. The physiological function of the immune system is to distinguish the self from the alien, so it needs a kind of self-knowledge and knowledge of the world. The recognition of our own body in the sense of immunological self-tolerance, that is, saying "yes" to it as an instrument of the individuality, prevents the destructive attacks of the immune system, and thus autoimmunity. Self-knowledge and world-knowledge not only determine the life processes of the immune system, but are the central developmental task of the human being. In many situations in life, the challenge of self-knowledge, that is, "know thyself", presents itself as a developmental task. However, efforts in this direction must not lead to isolation or even alienation from the world. On the contrary, self-knowledge leads to knowledge of the world, just as, conversely, knowledge of the world is connected with self-knowledge. At the annual conference we will be looking at the questions of human spiritual development and will deepen them through work on the path of knowledge of the Michael School, on the Gospels and the Foundation Stone Meditation.

We are very much looking forward to the forthcoming annual conference of the Medical Section at the Goetheanum, to meeting with you and to sharing experiences on these big topics!


